8. MOTION - (Hon. Elizabeth Kipsang, MCA, Baringo County)

AWARE THAT, Article 28 of the Constitution of Kenya provides that every person has inherent dignity and the right to have the dignity respected and protected;

FURTHER AWARE THAT, Article 43 (1) (d) of the Constitution of Kenya further provides that every person has a right to clean and safe water in adequate quantities;

RECOGNISING THAT, pursuant to section 63 of the Water Act, 2016 as read together with Resolution 64/292, the United Nations General Assembly explicitly recognized the human right to clean and safe water and sanitation and acknowledged that clean drinking water and sanitation are essential to the realization of all human rights;

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, the Action Plan from the United Nations Water Conference recognized water as a right for the first time declaring that “All peoples, whatever their stage of development and social and economic conditions, have the right to have access to drinking water of acceptable quantities and of a quality equal to their basic needs”;

DEEPLY DISTURBED THAT, a majority of the residents of Baringo have little or no access to clean and adequate water in their homes despite water being one of the functions bestowed upon the County Government by dint of clause 11(b) of Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution;

CONCERNED THAT, there has been massive roll-over of funds over the years in the County Department of Water and Irrigation yet such funds should have been utilized to ensure that the residents of Baringo have access to clean and safe water in acceptable quantities;

NOW THEREFORE, this Honourable House urges the County Government to:

- a) Ensure that residents of Baringo County have access to clean and safe water in acceptable quantities as it is a Constitutional right.
- b) The County Department of Water and Irrigation through the Committee on Water and Irrigation be compelled to ensure that funds meant for the provision of water to the residents are utilized in a manner intended so as to avoid scenarios of roll over funds year in, year out.
