6. NOTICES OF MOTION

1. (HON. ELIZABETH KIPSANG, MCA, BARINGO COUNTY)

AWARE THAT, the Constitution of Kenya as stipulated under Article 27(3) provides that women and men have the right to equal treatment, including the right to equal opportunities in political, economic, cultural and social spheres,

FURTHER AWARE THAT, Under Article 28, the Constitution reiterates that every person has inherent dignity and the right to have the dignity respected and protected,

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, Baringo County Revenue Clerks are operating under deplorable working conditions evidenced by poor attires they don while undertaking their responsibilities,

NOTING THAT, there is little or no motivation to the Revenue Clerks yet they play a vital role in ensuring the County Government realizes its revenue targets,

CONCERNED THAT, there are inadequate number of Revenue Clerks in the County who coupled by the fact that there is no gender balance among the existing number of Revenue Clerks,

DISTURBED THAT, there is no proper training of Revenue Clerks coupled by little or no knowledge of digitalization of the revenue collection,

NOW THEREFORE, this Motion urges the County Government to:

- 1. Provide proper attire to ensure the Revenue Clerks dress properly while undertaking their daily duties,
- 2. To provide this House with the number of Revenue Clerks currently employed by the County Government.
- 3. Ensure that the Revenue Clerks are motivated and conduct periodic trainings so as to bolster their knowledge on revenue collection by embracing technology.

2. (HON. NIXON LEMLLEM, MCA, MARIGAT WARD)

AWARE THAT, Article 1(1) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 vests all sovereign power in the Kenyan people which is to be exercised either directly by the people through public participation or indirectly through their democratically elected representatives,

FURTHER AWARE THAT, citizen participation was made a national value and a principle of public service in Articles 10(2a) and 232(1) of the Constitution and mandatory through section 115(1) & (2) of the County Government Act, 2012

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT, Section 115 (2) of County Governments Act states that each County Assembly shall develop laws and regulations giving effect to the requirement for effective citizen participation in development planning and performance management within the county and such laws and guidelines shall adhere to minimum national requirements,

NOW THEREFORE, this motion prays;

- 1. **THAT,** the pre-budget public participation process starts at the sub-locational level and culminates at the ward level.
- 2. **THAT**, the ward level Budget Committee be drawn from selected representatives from sub-Location level.
- **3. THAT**, the public participation participants at ward level, selected from the sub-locational level be facilitated with transport reimbursement.
