005/2020: Hon. Sam Limo Lourien, MCA, Tirioko Ward, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Education, Vocational Training and ICT Committee** on the following matters of concern:

- i.If he is aware that during the 2017/2018 Financial Year, ten plastic water tanks of 10,000 litre capacities were budgeted to be bought for ten (10) Tirioko ward ECDE centres?
- ii.If he is further aware that the ten tanks were to be distributed to the following ECDE centres namely:
 - a) Domo ECDE
 - b) Chemayes ECDE
 - c) Dira ECDE
 - d) Kangiruru ECDE
 - e) Kreze ECDE
 - f) Chischis ECDE
 - g) Katagh ECDE
 - h) Loyamoi ECDE
 - i) Chepkirial ECDE
 - j) Kamurio ECDE
- iii.Can the Chairperson confirm if the said tanks actually reached the intended ECDE centres?
- iv.Can the Chairperson without the use of signed list from the department table before this Honourable House the acknowledgment and or receipt letters of the said

tanks from each of the intended ECDE centres with photographic evidence on the availability of the said tanks in each of the listed centres?

- v. What measures is the County Government taking to ensure that the said tanks are availed to the respective ECDE centres?

(The Public Accounts and Investments Committee to investigate further and deliver the thirteen (13) tanks by all means and recommend surcharging of the persons found culpable. The report to be tabled in three (3) weeks' time)

- i. If he is aware that Migotiyo and Banita sisal estates owners are fencing their lands?
- ii. Whether there is any consultation between the Baringo County Government and Nakuru County Government and developers on County Borderlines?
- iii. Whether the requisite public participation has been conducted with the neighboring communities on boundary roads, lines and cross roads that is; Oinop-Motong to Noiwet-Oterit-Mukuyuni-Mototon to Koibarak?
- iv. Whether the above mentioned Counties have the original maps for the area mentioned.
- v. What measures will the concerned County Governments put in place to ensure that the borderlines and community rights of the said communities are observed in the course of pursuing development?

024/2021: Hon. Nixon Lemlem, MCA, Marigat Ward, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Tourism, Trade and Cooperative Committee** on the following matters of concern:

- i. If he is aware that there is a company called MONT SANTO Limited that contracted Marigat Farmers to produce maize seeds in the year 2020?
- ii. If he is further aware that the said company is yet to honour all the payments through Marigat Farmers Cooperative Society?
- iii. If he is aware that over 330 tonnes of seeds produced were delivered twelve months ago but the payment is yet to be paid?
- iv. What strategies/ measures is the County Government putting in place to protect the farmers from losing their farm outputs?
- v. What measures is the County Government putting in place to avoid such delay in future production?
- vi. How does the County Government Regulate seed companies engaging in contractual seed production in Perkerra irrigation scheme, other schemes within Baringo South and Baringo County at large, to ensure our farmers are not exploited?

025/2021: Hon. Elizabeth, MCA, Baringo County, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Health Services Committee** on the following matters of concern:

- i. If he is aware that asbestos used in roofing construction is a silent killer which can often go unnoticed, and the idea of its presence in the building surrounding people is enough to create feelings of uneasiness and concerns health-wise?
- ii. Can the Chairperson provide details of the number of casualties who have suffered as a result of use of asbestos roofing materials since the dangers of

asbestos poisoning have been well documented and has been banned in other countries such as the United Kingdom?

- iii. Can the Chairperson inform this House if adequate civic education has been conducted to educate the people of Baringo County of the adverse effects of the use of asbestos as roofing material?
- iv. Can the Chairperson further inform this House if he is aware that when asbestos fibers become loose and potentially airborne and when inhaled pose a risk to dangerous diseases such as lung cancer, pleural thickening etc. and if so, what is the County Government doing to avert these risks?
