012/2021: Hon. Jacob Cheboiwo, MCA, Kisanana Ward, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Justice and Legal Affairs, Devolution, Governance and Cohesion Committee** on the following matters of concern:

- i. If he is aware that Migotiyo and Banita sisal estates owners are fencing their lands?
- ii. Whether there is any consultation between the Baringo County Government and Nakuru County Government and developers on County Borderlines?
- iii. Whether the requisite public participation has been conducted with the neighboring communities on boundary roads, lines and cross roads that is; Oinop-Motong to Noiwet-Oterit-Mukuyuni-Mototon to Koibarak?
- iv. Whether the above mentioned Counties have the original maps for the area mentioned.
- v. What measures will the concerned County Governments put in place to ensure that the borderlines and community rights of the said communities are observed in the course of pursuing development?

018/2021 Hon. Musa Cheruyiot, MCA, Koibatek Ward, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Environment and Natural Resources Committee** on the following matters of great concern:

- i. If he is aware that Sabatia Forest, Esageri Forest and Koibatek Forest respectively have collectively been the bedrock of food security and bread basket of Eldama Ravine-Sub County and in extension the entire county through the sustainable *Shamba System*?

- ii. Is he further aware that the Kenya Forest Service (KFS) and the communities living around these forests have had a symbiotic relationship through the said *Shamba System* having practised it from the pre-independence era till last year 2020 when a circular from the Cabinet Secretary for Environment and Natural Resources outlawed planting of maize within the said forests which has been the sole source of livelihood of our people?
- iii. Is he aware that the affected farmers have been planting and caring for tree seedlings and taking care of tree plantations and in return they used to be awarded small parcels of land within the forests upon registration to till and plant their crops as they protect the said forests?
- iv. Is he further aware that most of the affected people are landless (natives of Baringo County) whose lives have now been disrupted since they depended on this system to earn their sustenance and livelihoods?
- v. What measures has the county government put in place to ensure that the affected families do not starve due to acute food shortage and do find an alternative source of livelihood if decision to scrap *the Shamba System* in these particular forests is not reversed?

021/2021: Hon. Lotela Nelson, MCA, Silale Ward, seeks a statement from the **Chairperson Preventive and Promotive Health Committee** on the following matters of concern:

- i. If he is aware that on 15th April, 2021 Nasorot dispensary was set on fire by a known person within the area as reported by the locals because it was affecting their businesses at Nasorot?

- ii. That no action has been taken against the said criminal as it was reported that the residents arrested the suspect and handed to the person in charge of health in Tiaty East, what happened?
- iii. Can the Chairperson give the local narrative on what transpired on Nasorot dispensary?
- iv. Did the County Executive Committee Member (CECM) and the Chief Officer (CO) visit the dispensary since the incident happened and if not why?
- v. Did the Committee visit the dispensary since the incident happened and if they have not, when are they going to undertake a fact finding field visit and report to the House?
- vi. Is he further aware of the quack health officers who hawk drugs in the area, do they have a licence to sell drugs at market centres in Silale Ward?
- vii. What action did the County Government take on Nasorot dispensary?
