THAT, in the 2022/2023 Financial Year, the people of Marigat Ward, Tuluongoi Location during public participation at Tebei Centre allocated ksh.1,562,500 to Tuluongoi quarry roads, that is;- Chemos quarry, Turkwe —sangarau quarry, Kelwon-Ketorit. However, the funds meant for the purchase of fuel for the road works mentioned above has been utilized and the works have not been done.

FURTHER THAT, during the same financial year, the same Location allocated Ksh.800, 000 to the excavation of Tebei dam, levelling of school fields and Tebei secondary school road. Moreover, the stated works have not been done and the budget was utilized, with that concern therefore;

- i. Which contractor was awarded the works and why the works have not been done?
- ii. How was the payment made yet the County works have to be paid after completion and inspection?
- iii. Where are the payment certificates for the respective works done in Tuluongoi location, Marigat ward?
- iv. Which officer was in charge of the said works?
- v. Would this be fraudulent agenda to siphon public funds and deny the intended beneficiaries of the much deserved infrastructure?
- vi. What remedy is the department putting in place to ensure that the stated works are timely completed?

THAT, the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Treasury and Planning is mandated to lead the Annual Development Plan (ADP) and the Annual Budget for the County.

THAT, during the 2023/24 FY, the following projects, totaling **Kshs. 8, 137,500** were well identified in the ADP and subsequently allocated budgets for by the residents of Bartabwa Ward.


